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Bridge survey to start on U.S. 59

Starting around March 5 and continuing for three months, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) will conduct a field survey in the vicinity of the Pottawatomie Creek Bridge on U.S. 59, approximately three miles north of Garnett. The surveyors will gather information necessary for a detailed design of a project to replace the bridge.

The area to be surveyed is approximately 500 feet along the existing bridge alignment. Survey activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the survey corridor. A survey crew member will first contact property owners and/or tenants for permission to enter private property. John H. Lilak, with the consultant firm of TranSystems Corporation, will be in charge of the survey.

The bridge is tentatively scheduled to be replaced in 2015. The survey is funded under the T-WORKS statewide transportation program approved by the Legislature in 2010. For more information about T-WORKS projects and funding visit the website, www.ksdot.org/tworks.
