I-35 crack repair project starts

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) has begun a crack repair project at two locations on I-35 at Ottawa. The project started Wednesday, Nov. 28, and is expected to be completed in 10 days.

Traffic will be reduced to one lane at each work zone. The crack repairs are being made in the I-35 northbound lanes just north of the K-68 interchange, and in the I-35 southbound lanes directly south of the 15th Street interchange.

KDOT awarded the construction contract of \$45,700 to Bryant & Bryant Construction of Halstead, Kan. David Baldrige, construction engineer at the Garnett KDOT office, reminds drivers to use extra caution and "Give 'Em a Brake!" at the work zone.

The preservation project is funded under the T-WORKS transportation program.
