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KDOT to begin field survey on U.S.160

Starting Monday, Nov. 18 and continuing for three weeks, weather permitting, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) will conduct a field survey for bank stabilization on the Neosho River on U.S.160 in Cherokee County. The survey will take place at the Neosho River Bridge located one mile east of the Labette-Cherokee county line.

The survey is based on the existing alignment. Activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the corridor. A member of the survey crew will first contact property owners and/or tenants for permission to enter private property. Rob Selley, L.S., Field Survey Project Manager, will be in charge of this survey for KDOT.
